

Results of SASEC SCBTM Workshop

- There is a need to facilitate cross-border transport
- UNESCAP SCBTM provides possible solutions
 - Hong Kong Shenzhen, PRC: trans-customs clearance
 - Thai model: electronic cargo system for inland transit
 - Lancang/Mekong river navigation and monitoring
- Agreed on the need for national consultations



Results of Bhutan National Workshop

- Pilot application of electronic tracking to be explored
 - Possible corridor: Kolkata-Jaigaon-Phuentsholing-Thimphu
- Agreed to conduct feasibility study
 - Technical design
 - Institutional arrangements
 - Suitability of vehicles for use of the system
 - Costs and benefits
 - Financial and economic analyses
- DRC to be the lead agency



Results of Bhutan National Workshop

- Scope of tracking entire trip
- Use of common tracking software is preferred
- Information between relevant parties may be shared
- Tracking centers in Thimphu, Phuentsholing, Kolkata
- Potential to interface with e-customs to be checked
- Pilot to cover vehicles and goods (incl vehicles)



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
